The Greater Grand Traverse Area Continuum of Care requests \$49,640 to fund 1 FTE Continuum of Care Coordinator to: 1. Coordinate and facilitate the workgroups to end homelessness of the CoC. 2. Create an inclusive membership body of the CoC workgroups while implementing ongoing recruitment. 3. Monitor project and system performance, enforce compliance to CoC and ESG program regulations, housing first, criteria for project performance and review for the CoC competition, and complete the CoC Program application. 4. Implement and monitor CoC policies and ensure project compliance.

Planning includes:

- 1.Coordinate and facilitate planning activities of the CoC workgroups. Creating monthly agendas aligned with the Federal and State Strategic plans and local priorities developed within the workgroups, meeting minutes, and maintaining a planning calendar. An annual plan will be created that encompasses each workgroup goal. This will inform a 5 year plan to end homelessness in the Greater Grand Traverse Area for all populations.
- 2.Continue to perform outreach to invite community stakeholders to semiannual CoC meetings. The semi-annual meetings will be structured in a way that allows community stakeholders to share feedback on the homeless response system and will identify actionable steps for improvement of enhanced partnership. Stakeholders will be provided with updates to the annual plan to end homelessness.
- 3. Coordinate the PIT and HIC while conducting a housing and service gap analysis informed by the Data and Standards workgroup.
- 4.Perform monitoring of recipient performance, evaluate outcomes and identify corrective action based on quarterly project performance scorecards. Project evaluation initiatives will work to reduce the length of time homeless, increase income for program participants, improve permanent destination rates, as well as decrease the amount of people entering homelessness for the first time. 5.In partnership with the Michigan State Housing Development Authority, perform local monitoring of the performance of ESG projects in alignment with the CoC program.
- 6.The Coordinator will work with membership to review and update all CoC written standards. Prioritize increasing the Diversity, Equity and Inclusion of the CoC membership. Due to the small size of the CoC, much of the Diversity, Equity and Inclusion work has been carried out by the individual agencies of the CoC. With increased staffing at the CoC level, Racial Equity initiatives that support decreasing and ultimately eliminating racial disparity within our homeless population will commence. Happening alongside this initiative, will be an enhanced recruitment effort around including more people with lived experience to become members of the CoC. Membership will include decision making capacity around project implementation and oversight and will be overseen by the Coordinator.

2. Describe the estimated schedule for the proposed activities, the management plan, and the method for assuring effective and timely completion of all work.

The Coordination work is ongoing, and is overseen by the Steering Committee and ultimately the Executive Committee of the CoC. Monthly meetings of the CoC workgroups to end homelessness are always occurring and are being coordinated throughout the year by the CoC Coordinator. Steering Committee meetings also occur monthly in order to align priorities and evaluate performance of the workgroups. Work to recruit and engage community stakeholders in the work to end homelessness is also ongoing.

- 1. Coordination of CoC planning activities and workgroups Month 1, monthly to completion
- 2. Project and System Monitoring and Evaluation Month 1, monthly to completion
- 3. Policies and Procedures for HUD Compliance Month 1-6. Racial equity work month 1-ongoing.
- 4. Annual workgroup plan: month 1-completion.
- 5. Five year plan to end homelessness-Month 2-monthly until completion during the grant term.

3. How will the requested funds improve or maintain the CoC's ability to evaluate the outcome of CoC and ESG projects?

Having someone in the role of CoC Coordinator allows project grantees to concentrate of program/project improvements while larger system coordinator efforts are led throughout the collaborative process of the CoC membership. As the CoC Coordinator has increased from a part-time position, to now, 1 FTE, capacity to monitor and evaluate the outcomes of CoC and ESG projects has increased significantly. The addition of a data and standards workgroup tasked with monitoring the overall system performance of the CoC is a critical part of improved evaluation processes. As our CoC is very small, there has always been limited capacity of the recipients/sub recipients to do work beyond what is mandated without someone to bring all the pieces together and develop the appropriate context for making sure all projects have high expectations for performance. The CoC planning and implementation activities would be limited without CoC Planning funds, slowing implementation on data reporting and analysis of greater system improvement efforts.
